About Enter the Den

- Enter the Den is a student business plan competition that offers cash prizes to the winners
- First step of Enter the Den is to submit a business idea application on a product or service of your choice
- From there, the submissions are reviewed, and 7 semi finalists are chosen from each category to present in front of a panel of 5 judges
- From the semi-finals, 5 finalists are chosen to present in front of a new panel of 5 different judges. Only the finals will be a live presentation with others invited to watch

Young entrepreneurs are more willing to take risks and move off the "mainstream ideas" to create new ones, breaking down barriers to further succeed





Enter the Den Application

- The applications form is listed in the top right corner of the website
- Participants will need to fill in the two-page application which includes describing the business they would like to do
- It is important to be specific when describing your idea and to sell the idea to the selection committee



Competition Details

How Enter the Den Works:

Application: Develop your idea and submit your APPLICATION by the posted date. We recommend you discuss and review your application with one of your school's business teachers prior to submission.

Business Plan Preparation: After the due date, we will contact you by email or phone and let you know if you have been selected to proceed to the next round of the contest. You will have 48 hours to inform Thunder Bay Ventures of your intent to participate. If you're selected to go to the next round, then it's time to prepare your business plan. Again, we strongly recommend students seek guidance from their business teachers in the development of their business plans.

Semi-Finals: Students selected for the semi-finals will present and defend their business plans to a panel of judges. Please make sure you have practiced your verbal pitch and are familiar with all your details, as you will be asked questions. You may use video, audio recordings, PowerPoint presentation or other media to convey your ideas, however it is not a requirement.

Finals: Students chosen to move forward to the finals will receive feedback on how to improve their presentations before the next round with new judges.

Your Business Idea

Your business does not have to be new but it should be unique, and it should be something that you feel confident presenting and "selling" to the judges

"What sets your business apart from others?"

"Why would someone use your product or service over someone else?"
